Yeshua (Jesus) In The Tanakh (Old Testament)

Isaiah 9 points to Yeshua, the Prince of Peace, ruling on the throne of David. For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even for ever. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will perform this. Isaiah 9:6-7 King James Bible version

Isaiah 53 points to Yeshua, the high priest, atoning for sins. For he shall grow up before him as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground: he hath no form nor comeliness; and when we shall see him, there is no beauty that we should desire him. He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was despised, and we esteemed him not. Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace (Shiloh) was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth. He was taken from prison and from judgment: and who shall declare his generation? For he was cut off out of the land of the living: for the transgression of my people was he stricken. And he made his grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death; because he had done no violence, neither was any deceit in his mouth. Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise him; he hath put him to grief: when thou shalt make his soul an offering for sin, he shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in his hand. He shall see of the travail of his soul, and shall be satisfied: by his knowledge shall my righteous servant justify many; for he shall bear their iniquities. Therefore will I divide him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he hath poured out his soul unto death: and he was numbered with the transgressors; and he bare the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

Daniel 9:24-27 points to Mashiyach carrying out His ministry and being a sacrifice for sin during the seven years of the 70th week, which took place from 27-34 AD. Seventy weeks are determined upon thy people and upon thy holy city, to finish the transgression, and to make an end of sins, and to make reconciliation for iniquity, and to bring in everlasting righteousness, and to seal up the vision and prophecy, and to anoint the most Holy. Know therefore and understand, that from the going forth of the commandment (which was given in 457 BC) to restore and to build Jerusalem unto the Messiah the Prince shall be seven weeks, and threescore and two weeks: the street shall be built again, and the wall, even in troublous times. And after threescore and two weeks shall Messiah be cut off (Isaiah 53:8 points to the violent death of crucifixion), but not for himself (He died for our sins). And he shall confirm the (everlasting Abrahamic) covenant with many for one week (the seven years of the 70th week took place from 27-34 AD, during which Messiah carried out His multiyear ministry): and in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease (as His blood atonement as the Spotless Lamb paid for sins, ending the need for animal sacrifices).

Daniel 12:1-3 points to the Jews who believed in Yeshua being delivered and given everlasting life. And at that time shall Michael stand up, the great prince which standeth for the children of thy people: and there shall be a time of trouble, such as never was since there was a nation even to that same time: and at that time thy people shall be delivered, every one that shall be found written in the book. And many of them that sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. And they that be wise shall shine as the brightness of the firmament; and they that turn many to righteousness as the stars for ever and ever.

Yeshua (Jesus) In The B'rit Chadashah (New Testament)

Matthew 1 gives the genealogy of Yeshua, the Son of David. The book of the generation of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham. King James Bible version

Messiah saves His people. And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins. Matthew 1:21

Messiah was circumcised on the eighth day. And when eight days were accomplished for the circumcising of the child, his name was called JESUS, which was so named of the angel before he was conceived in the womb. Luke 2:21

Messiah's mother, Mary, went through purification after His birth. And when the days of her purification according to the law of Moses were accomplished, they brought him to Jerusalem, to present him to the Lord. Luke 2:22

Messiah is the Seed of Abraham. *Now to Abraham and his seed were the promises made. He saith not, And to seeds, as of many; but as of one, And to thy seed,* which is Christ. Galatians 3:16

Messiah is a priest after the order of Melchizedek Whither the forerunner is for us entered, even Jesus, made an high priest for ever after the order of Melchisedec. Hebrews 6:20

Messiah is of the tribe of Judah. For it is evident that our Lord sprang out of Judah; of which tribe Moses spake nothing concerning priesthood. Hebrews 7:14

Messiah is the Lion of the tribe of Judah. *And one of the elders saith unto me, Weep not: behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, hath prevailed to open the book, and to loose the seven seals thereof.* Revelation 5:5

Christ is our Passover sacrifice. *Purge out therefore the old leaven, that ye may be a new lump, as ye are unleavened. For even Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.* 1 Corinthians 5:7

Messiah was lifted up for our redemption. And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life. For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved. John 3:14-17

Yeshua rose again. Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. 1 Peter 1:3

He returned to Yahweh. Ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. And when he had spoken these things, while they beheld, he was taken up; and a cloud received him out of their sight. Acts 1:8-9

Messiah reigns on David's throne forever. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David. Luke 1:32-33

Yeshua reigns over the house of Jacob. *And he shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end.* Luke 1:33

Messiah's Ekklesia was formed with believing Jews. 3,000 believed on the Day of Pentecost when the Ruach Spirit was poured out, and more were added daily. Messiah is the cornerstone, the disciples the foundation, and the saints the stones that make up the walls of the temple in which the Heavenly Father dwells.

Read the New Testament gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, and the book of Hebrews.

Yeshua (Jesus) Foretold These Prophecies, Validating His Deity

Yeshua foretold the desolation of the unbelieving Jewish nation in 70 AD.

In Matthew 24, Mark 13, and Luke 21, He foretold the events that led up to the Jewish-Roman War of 66-70 AD, when judgment was poured out on the unbelieving Jewish nation that rejected Him and delivered Him up to be crucified. The Jewish leaders declared, "we have no king but Caesar," and "let His blood be on us."

A time of great tribulation came upon the unbelieving Jewish nation, as 1.1 million Jews died in and around Jerusalem from famine, pestilence, infighting, suicide, evisceration, crucifixion, and by the Roman sword. 97,000 were captured and sold as slaves.

The Jews who believed in Messiah were saved from the calamity, as they heeded the sign of the *abomination of desolation* and escaped to the mountains of Pella for safety. The Olivet Discourse prophecy validates the authority of the New Testament and the deity of Yeshua, who foretold the events. Daniel 12 foretold the 3 ½ years of the Jewish-Roman War of 66-70 AD. The *time of Jacob's Trouble* came upon the unbelieving Jewish nation who wickedly delivered their promised Messiah up to be killed, continuing in the tradition of their fathers who killed the prophets that were sent to them.

There were 3 ½ years from the sign of the *abomination of desolation*, which occurred in November 66 AD, when Cestius and his army surrounded Jerusalem to take it captive, until the Roman army flooded into Jerusalem in 70 AD to destroy the unbelieving Jews, Jerusalem, and the temple.

The prophecy was *sealed up* from the eyes of the unbelieving Jews lest they understand their coming judgment and escape Jerusalem. The believing Jews were delivered from this *time of trouble*, and they shined the light of the Gospel to draw more Jews into faith in the Heavenly Father's Son.

In the book of Revelation, Yeshua foretold many events that have been fulfilled during the last 1,900 years. He foretold what His followers would face from the first century until His return.

He foretold the persecution of His followers by the pagan Roman emperors, and then the popes who caused many of Messiah's saints to be tortured and killed during the Dark Ages and Inquisition.

He foretold the false Christian religion of Romanism by the Roman Catholic Church, which teaches a false gospel, a false intercessor in Mary, and many manmade concepts that are contrary to Scripture.

He foretold the decline and fall of the once-mighty Roman Empire, from bloody civil wars, economic strife, famine, pestilence, and barbarian armies being sent to attack it.

He foretold Zionist Israel, which is controlled by Edomite Lord Rothschild and political Zionists, who use the sorcery of the Egyptian Kabbalah. In the name of being a Jew, they've taken what belongs to Jacob/Israel.

He foretold that *Holy Jerusalem* is the spiritual city that Abraham looked for, populated by Jews and Gentiles who have a covenant relationship with the Father through the Son.

Most of the prophecies have been fulfilled, and there's not much left before Messiah's return for His set-apart saints. This apocalyptic vision validates the authority of the New Testament and the deity of Yeshua.

Yeshua (Jesus) Did Not Teach These Manmade Doctrines

Messiah went to Jerusalem to observe the Holy Feast Days. *And the Jews' Passover was at hand, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.* John 2:13

Yeshua is fulfilling His Father's seven Holy Feast Days to redeem the set-apart ones. He died as the Spotless Passover Lamb so that the punishment of death because of sin passes over His followers. He was dead in the grave on the Feast of Unleavened Bread, pointing to His sinlessness. He rose again on the Feast of First Fruits. He sent the Ruach Spirit on the Day of Pentecost. He will return on the Feast of Trumpets, make judgment on the Day of Atonement, and marry His bride on the Feast of Tabernacles.

The manmade doctrine of Easter and Christmas is a perversion that Emperor Constantine and the Roman bishops created in the fourth century. They did this to push aside the remembrance of the Father's Holy Feast Days, which are divine appointments that Messiah is fulfilling to redeem the set-apart ones. Sadly, most Christians observe these pagan-based holidays and ignore the Father's Holy Feast Days.

Messiah observed the Scriptural Sabbath day. He went into Jewish synagogues on the Sabbath. And when the Sabbath day was come, he began to teach in the synagogue: and many hearing him were astonished, saying, From whence hath this man these things? And what wisdom is this which is given unto him, that even such mighty works are wrought by his hands? Mark 6:2

Emperor Constantine and the Roman bishops promoted Sunday Lord's Day to push aside the Scriptural calendar and Sabbath observance.

Messiah pointed to the law and the prophets and promoted their teachings. He proclaimed that He fulfilled the law and the prophets, so His sacrifice as the Spotless Passover Lamb atones for our sins.

Think not that I am come to destroy the law, or the prophets: I am not come to destroy, but to fulfill. For verily I say unto you, Till heaven and earth pass, one jot or one tittle shall in no wise pass from the law, till all be fulfilled. Matthew 5:17-18

He never said that the law and prophets were done away with, as some Christians believe.

Messiah taught His followers to obey the Father's Ten Commandments. He summarized it by saying that we are to love the Father, which addresses the first four commandments, and to love your neighbor as yourself, which addresses the last six commandments.

Master, which is the great commandment in the law? Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets. Matthew 22:36-40

Yeshua taught His followers to pray to the Heavenly Father, not to Himself, not to saints, nor Mary. He said to pray to the Heavenly Father in His name, as Messiah is our intercessor to the Father.

But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly. Matthew 6:6

The Messiah of Scripture is very different than the one that is promoted by Roman Christianity.
